Some issues – Day 1


- Community FAD management is the way forward for sustainable FAD fishing and user pay system is a good way for communities to raise management fees from users.
- ✓ FAD user conflict is an issue raised especially on Efate where fishing pressure is highest. VFD to come up with better ways to control user conflicts - one likely option is to separate fishing area by zone and to enforce fishing licenses
- ✓ Giant clam farming on Efate is a good business for Aquarium exports but it seems to slow down, lack of interest??
- ✓ High loss of artificially bred trochus and green snail released, communities need to focus on management of wild stock trochus and green snail.
- Shell handicraft groing interest raised need to assess options protect the fishery for local indigenous Ni-Vanuatu exporters to develop. Same with green snail and other shells.
- Opportunities for community fishery management plans to be aligned with National Fisheries Policies

- 2010 data recorded to VFD





Lobster production-

Composition by region






Lobster catch sold 2013

Total no of lobster sold




2011 - 1,269 lobster sold Jan - June2013 - 334 lobster sold Jan - June


Green snail

- Efate supply green snail to French Polynesia 1967
- 300 shells, 42 survive 12 day voyage by ship
- Release at Papeete Island
- 13 years later establish
- Export fell to zero from 2000
- Efate stock in question?
- 15 years ban 2005







Trochus size – North Vanuatu

- Undersize common in many areas
- Continuing problem
- Difficult to prosecute
- Community control important but is not happening
- Any other Solution??

- ✓ SPC would like to invite one community rep from Vanuatu to present the CBCRM approach to the Pacific regional community based workshop in March 2015
- ✓ Release of the article in the SPC Fisheries Newsletter is going to attract many interest from other countries
